Introduction:

ivelihood involves a set of economic activities, involving self-employment and/or wage-employment. Less than 10% of rural workers in India are employed on a regular basis. Poor rural households engage in more than one activity for their livelihoods. Given the magnitude of the problem, and the lack of resources for livelihood promotion, the task of promoting livelihoods for the poor becomes all the more urgent. It calls for organizations to use their resources optimally to achieve maximum scale. The primary reason to promote livelihoods is the belief in the essential right of all human beings to equal opportunity. Poor people do not have life choices, nor do they have opportunities. Ensuring that a poor household has a stable livelihood will substantially increase its income, and over a period of time, asset ownership, selfesteem and social participation.

The Government of Tamil Nadu implements a number of programmes / schemes through different departments to promote livelihood of the people. Substantial public investments have been made for strengthening of economy and livelihood of the poor, especially the marginalized groups like SC/STs and women. To effectively address the issue of poverty alleviation, there is a need to optimize efforts through inter-sectoral convergence approaches. This convergence will bring in synergies between different government programmes/schemes in terms of planning, process and implementation. For example, those that are involved in farm and off-farm activities shall avail services through the following schemes such as MGNREGA, RSETI, KVIC, DDU-GKY, PMKY, Watershed Mission, ATMA, KVK, MKSP and SVEP.

This handbook, produced by VKP, will provide a compilation of schemes, and its salient features, implemented by various departments of Government of Tamil Nadu, pertaining to livelihood activities. This shall act as a ready reckoner for all those who want to refer to Government sponsored livelihood schemes.
